Course participation	30%	1-3	Class discussions and participation will encourage, reward, and assess students' active contribution to analysis and their active engagement with other students.
Presentation	30%	1-3	The presentation will assess the cumulative skills set acquired by the students in this course. The presentation will test the students' ability to: (1) Evaluate and analysis a current art topic in relation to the learnt knowledge in class about the art movement, theoretical support and cultural influence. (2) Apply and explain the present state of art through theoretical and critical approaches and perspectives.

Review Writing	40%	1-3	The review writing will test the students' ability to: apply the appropriate theories to analyze and evaluate art pieces. The students will also be assessed on their analytical skills and on appreciating and expressing own prospective and point of view towards selected art pieces.

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
