Group Presentation	25 %	1, 2, 3	Students are required to select a topic, collect reference materials and make a group presentation and lead the discussion; other students have to take part in the discussion. Students' ability of CLOI 1 - 3 will be demonstrated.
Term Paper	30 %	1, 2, 3	The Term Paper are to test the students' learning

			in relation to CILOs 1-3. Students' ability to present their ideas and arguments logically is tested.
Exam	30 %	1, 2, 3	The Exam is an exercise to test students' ability to demonstrate their achievement in learning CILOs 1-3. Students' ability to present arguments critically and fluently in written form can be tested.
Participation & Attendance	15 %	3	Students' understanding of CILO 3 and their participation and ability to present their ideas and arguments verbally will be tested.

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
